As we rode around the ravine looking at the azaleas, there was a loud "poing" sound as my spoke broke. After 75 miles of riding, I had to SAG to the finish. The rest of the century riders road north back to Green Cove Springs, only slowing down to cross a one-mile unpaved road.
